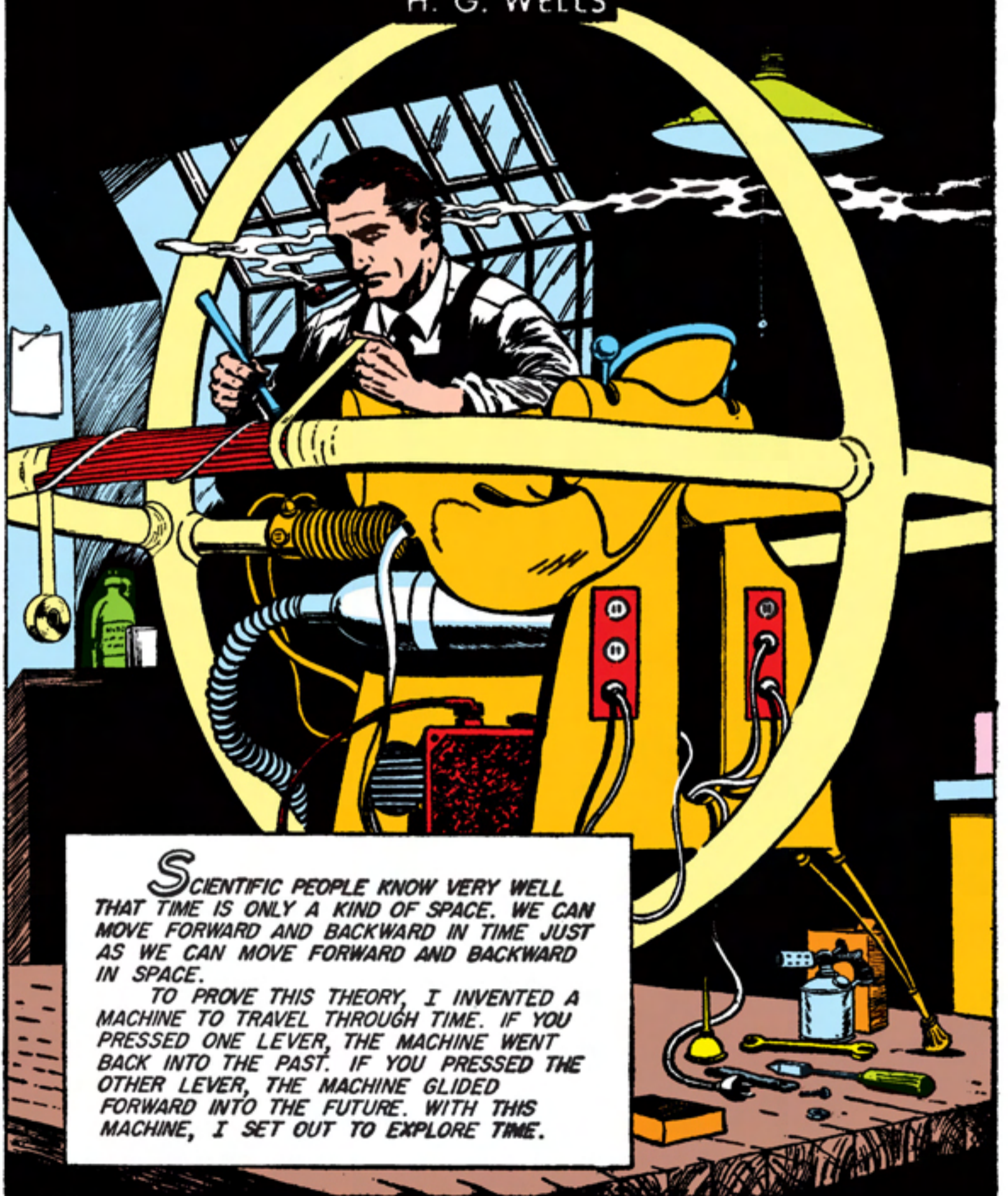

I LOOKED AT THE CLOCK.

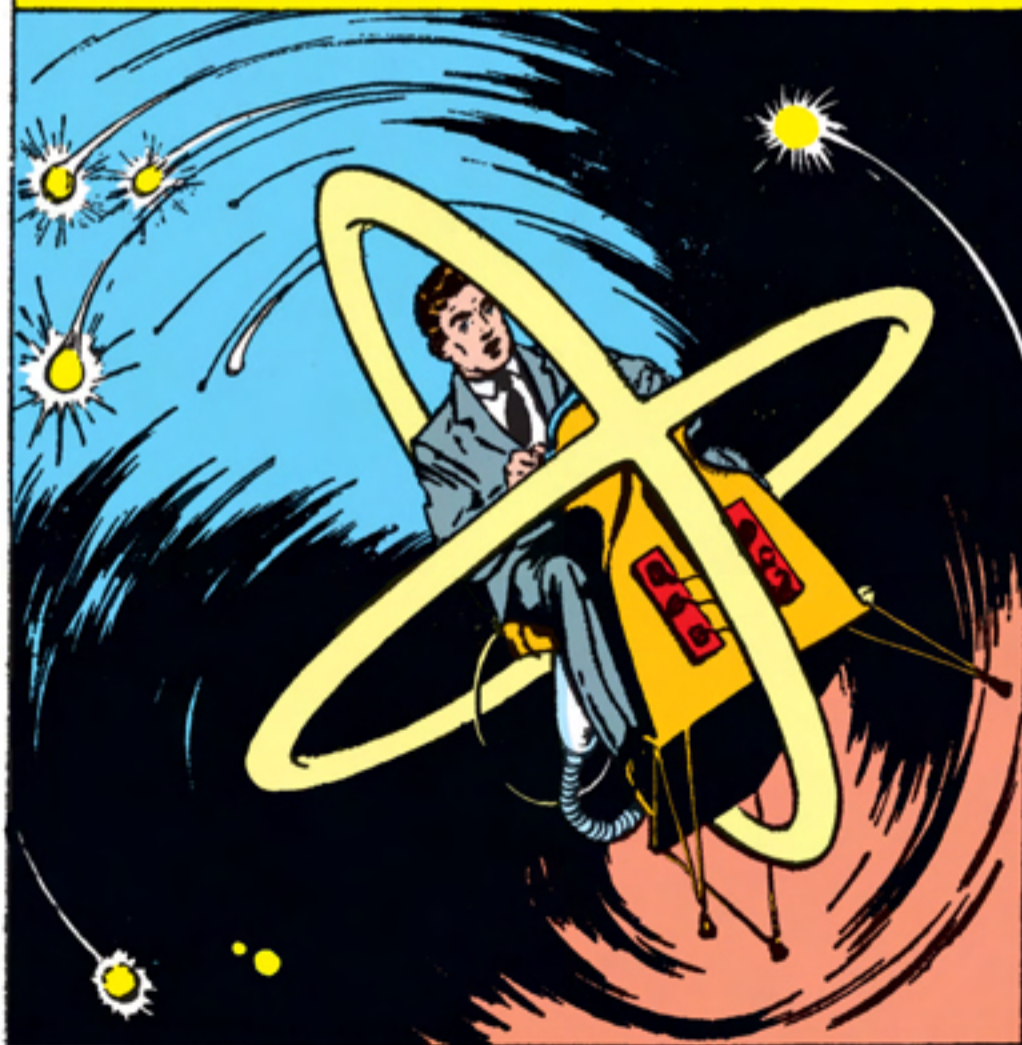
I HAVE MOVED AHEAD FIVE HOURS!
